PUT OUT INTO THE DEEP WATER

"Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." (Luke 5:4)

After a night of toiling, Jesus challenges his future disciples to set out once more and cast their nets again. This requires them to let go of their own tried-and-tested methods in order to obey Jesus' command. This step of faith proves to be worthwhile: their nets are overflowing!

This is the challenge that many parishes are facing today: do we dare to take a chance and set sail into the deep? What is holding us back? And what comes after; how do we persevere?

The conference will offer ample opportunity to explore these themes in depth – through lectures, various seminars, personal testimonies, and the informal meetings with fellow participants.

MAIN SPEAKERS

Fr. James Mallon

principles described in the book

Fr. James is closely involved in the international ministry of Divine Renovation and he is a sought-after speaker on the themes of parish renewal and evangelization.

The topics of his lectures are taken from the Gospel reading from Luke 5:

'We have toiled all night',
'At your word I will cast out my nets' and 'Do not be afraid, from now on you will

catch men'.

Sr. Theresa Anne is a sister of the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia, originally from Nashville, Tennessee. The apostolic goal of the sisters is to inspire children, young people and their families to get to know Jesus Christ and the redeeming truth of the Gospel. Sr. Theresa Anne has a master's degree in theology and is involved in various forms of catechesis for children and adults within (and outside of) parishes.

On Thursday evening, she will speak on the theme "Lord, depart from me, for I am a sinful person" - Where do I stand in my relationship

with Christ? Where does the Lord invite me to deeper conversion and change? How do I deal with my own brokenness, also in relation to the parish?
